


# ILLINOIS HEARTLAND WALK TO EMMAUS

### **About East Bay Camp**

The Walks this Spring will once again be held at East Bay Camp. East Bay Camp & Retreat is located in Central Illinois on beautiful Lake Bloomington just 12 miles north of Bloomington-Normal at Hudson, IL, just a few minutes from Interstate 39. The address is: 24248 Ron Smith Memorial Highway Hudson, IL 61748.

Lodging is dormitory style in Pilchard Hall and Hummel Hall. Pilchard and Hummel are fully climate-controlled and are accessible to persons with disabilities. The dining hall is about 100 steps away from Pilchard.

The Camp provides the noon and dinner meals which will be served in the dining hall. Breakfast will be continental style provided by the Emmaus Community.



## **Encouragement For Living**



#### Galatians 2:20

I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me.

Jesus died on the cross in my place - in your place....it was like me and you up on that cross. Our old life is dead. Now we are alive in Christ and have the indwelling of the Holy Spirit in us. Our life is no longer our own. It belongs to Jesus. We are the managers of it. We live daily by faith (not under the law as we now live under grace). I will always treasure the memories of that walk and the many others where I served on the team or in the background. The board already had weekends scheduled for the fall after a long pause due to the COVID 19 pandemic. What a blow! But as always, God is faithful and had a plan! The board searched for alternate locations that would support our weekends, and we found that East Bay Camp was available!

Walks 101 and 102 were held. While the location is further than we were accustomed to, I think all the pilgrims and team would agree, East Bay is the perfect place to spend a weekend with Jesus! East Bay provided lunch and dinner. The community provided continental breakfast. The lake and trees in their fall colors were beautiful and peaceful. We are looking forward to our spring walks 4/20-4/23 and 4/27-4/30.

This year will be another year of change! The data about our community and its members is now being entered into MinistryManager provided by Upper Room at no cost to us. The previous database used did have a monthly expense which we gladly gave up in an effort to be good stewards of the money provided to us by the community. As is the case with all new systems, we are working out the kinks. One of the culture changes we found is the terminology used by Upper Room. Table Leaders will now be known as Assistant Table Leaders, and Speakers will be known as Table Leaders. Their functions on the team have not changed, just their title. The other change we found is that only 2 talks and Assistant Table Leader experience are required to serve as an Assistant Lay Director. That is a good change which will help in the progression toward serving as a Weekend Lay Director!

The focus of the Board this year is to increase communication, revive group reunions, and improve our website (Illinois Heartland Walk to Emmaus).
